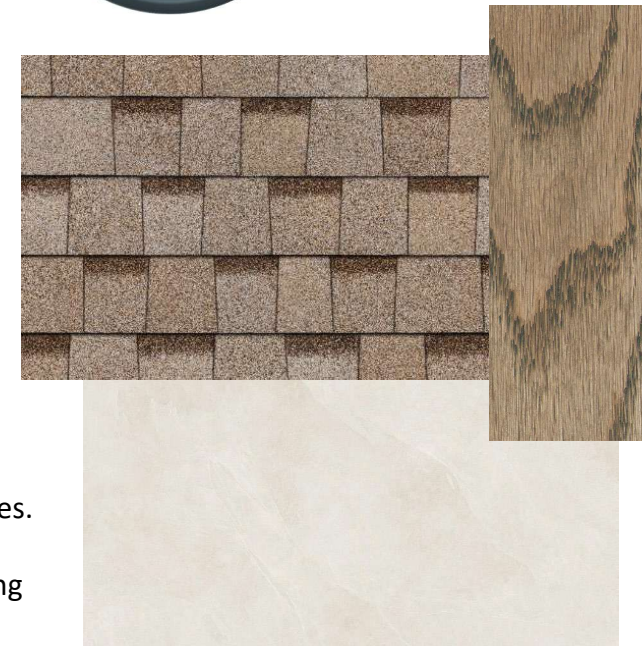

Rooted in the timeless elegance of Tudor architecture, this home's exterior selections blend classic charm with modern sophistication. The facade is finished in Greek Villa, a warm, creamy white that highlights the architectural detailing while providing a clean, refined backdrop. Complementing this is Waterloo, a rich, muted tone used strategically to add depth and contrast, evoking a sense of storybook charm characteristic of traditional Tudor homes. Stained cedar accents bring warmth and texture, accentuating key architectural features while echoing the handcrafted nature of historic Tudor design. Distinctive swooped roof pitches enhance the home's silhouette, adding a soft, romantic profile that is both unique and authentic to the style.



The interior design of this home seamlessly continues the refined Tudor narrative with a thoughtful blend of tradition and modern luxury. Upon entry, light wood flooring laid in a herringbone pattern in the foyer sets an immediate tone of timeless sophistication—a subtle homage to the craftsmanship and detail associated with Tudor homes.

In the heart of the home, the kitchen features custom white perimeter cabinetry, offering a bright, clean foundation, while a contrasting blue island provides depth and a subtle nod to the rich, moody palette. Counter backsplash treatment, paired with a curved wing wall detail and decorative countertop edge, elevates the space with graceful contours and custom detailing that speak to the ornate nature of the style.

White Café appliances with bronze handles blend modern performance with vintage-inspired charm, complementing the warm tones and elegant finishes throughout. Anchoring the living space is a wood-burning fireplace framed by a cast stone surround, a hallmark feature that echoes the grand hearths of historic Tudor homes.

In the dining room, wainscoting adds architectural interest and texture, while a tray ceiling adds height and a sense of formality, creating a space equally suited for intimate dinners or elegant gatherings.

Primary Bath



Marble-look tile on the shower walls, from floor to ceiling, brings a sense of grandeur and timeless elegance, while the Calacatta-look herringbone mosaic tile on the shower floor introduces texture and a refined, artisanal quality into this sanctuary.

Above the freestanding tub, a barrel-vaulted ceiling with a custom finish adds architectural drama and softness, echoing the curvature of Tudor-style elements. This curved motif is further emphasized in the arched vanity mirrors, which not only introduce graceful lines but also continue the round detailing established in the home's swooped roof pitches and arched backsplash accents in the kitchen.

Custom stained vanity cabinets provide warmth and a handcrafted feel, reinforcing the rich, natural material palette. The result is a space that feels both luxurious and rooted in architectural heritage—thoughtfully balancing old-world charm with modern functionality.

Primary Suite

The primary bedroom continues the home's thoughtful design narrative with elements that speak to both comfort and architectural continuity. Three expansive windows overlooking the backyard flood the space with natural light, creating an inviting and airy retreat that still feels grounded in classic design. The abundance of natural light highlights the room's fine details such as the tray ceiling, to add dimension and a sense of formality, nodding to the grand ceiling treatments found in traditional Tudor interiors. Together, these selections create a space that is refined yet relaxed—beautifully blending historical inspiration with modern-day livability.

Secondary Baths



A neutral flooring tile grounds the secondary bathroom with understated sophistication, allowing the architectural details and curated finishes to shine. In this space, marble-look tile on the shower walls evokes the classic luxury.

The custom stained vanity cabinets introduce warmth and a nod to the natural woodwork seen in traditional Tudor interiors, balancing rich earth tones with artisanal quality. Complementing these elements, polished nickel plumbing fixtures provide a subtle, silvery luster—a graceful counterpoint to the wood and stone elements—that speaks to both period-appropriate elegance and contemporary refinement.

Secondary Bedrooms

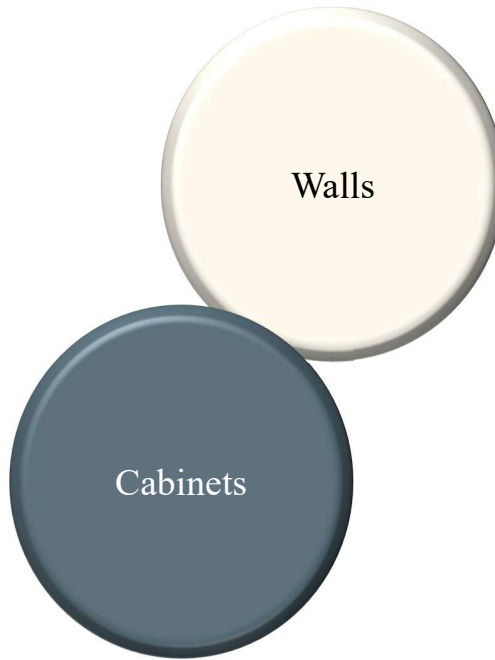

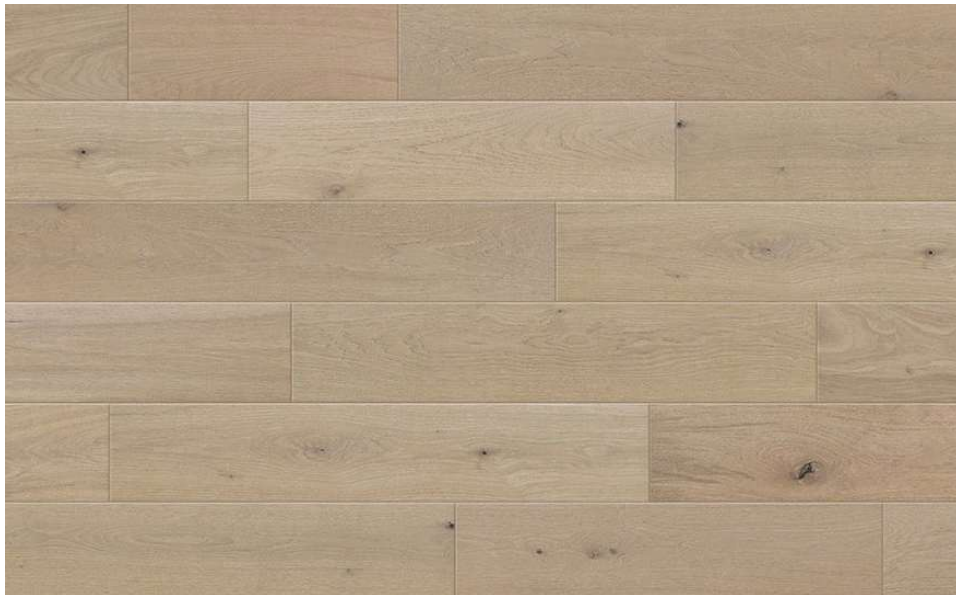
